# The Strawberry Farm

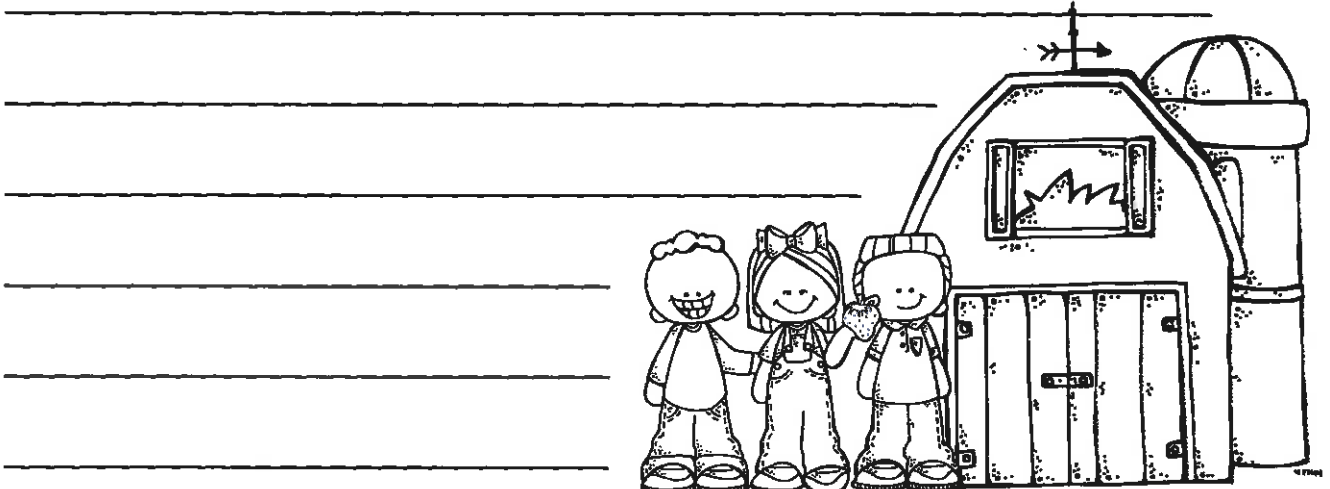

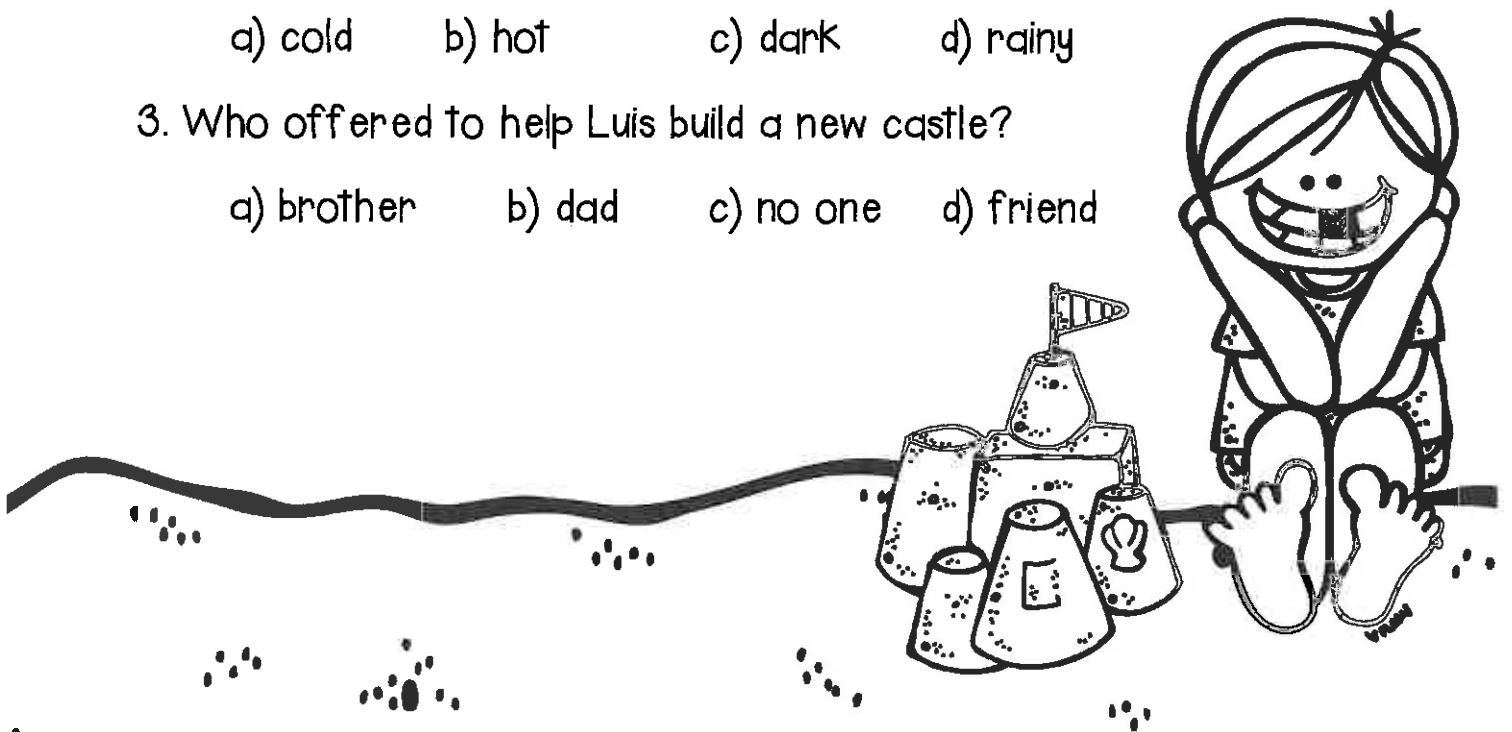
